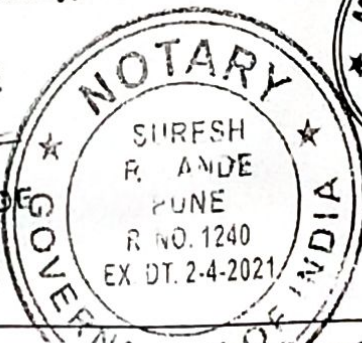

The above mentioned Memorandum of Association executed on 22.12.2016 between above said parties in pursuant to license agreement executed on 08.01.2016, shall continue till the contract between the Maharashtra Technical Education Society and Shashwat Multispecialty Hospital India Pvt Ltd continuous

Above said both the parties undertake to give clinical training to the medical students studying at DSHMC. On below mention terms and condition

Annexure I

(Terms & Condition relevant to clinical Training of DSHMC Students)

A) **Teaching - (Clinics, Operating Procedures, Labor Conduction Casualty, ICU Management etc.**

1. The Company accepts the Sanjeevan Hospital as teaching institute Vis-a the DSHMC and NMRMH Hospital which is the flagship institution of the Society, and as such is committed to contribute to ensure academic excellence as common goal of the two parties. The Company further assures to extend fullest co-operation with regard to the clinical training, conduction of examinations (Internal and University) and support during periodical inspections/visits by all the affiliating and regulatory authorities namely CCH, MCH, State Directorate of Homeopathy/ State and Central Ministry Officials, MUHS and other visiting dignitaries etc. with proper prior intimation to the Hospital authorities.
2. Teaching faculty, medical students (UG and PG), interns of the DSHMC and NMRH Hospital will have free access to the hospital as per posting plan although their movements will be governed by the internal discipline of the Hospital.
3. The Students and interns of the DSHMC in small batches will be allowed to be posted to all the major and minor departments like medicine, surgery, gynecology & obstetrics, ENT, Ophthalmology, Ortho Skin, Dental, Psychiatry, Emergency and the Critical care units etc. of the new Hospital as per the retirements and time table of the College. These students and interns will be trained in clinical methods like any modern graduate in these subjects by these departments. The actual syllabus/ teaching assignments to be completed by



July

- them will be provided in advance by the principal and PG director respectively
- 4. The Patients of the Hospital both from O.P.D & I.P.D shall be made available to the students & Faculty member as clinical material for UG & PG examinations, both internal as well as University Examinations with prior intimation of examination schedule to the Hospital
- 5. Students/interns will be allowed to assist in operative procedure (major /minor) conduction of Labour, ward procedure etc in all the departments like Medicine Pediatrics, Surgery, and Gynec & Obs., Ophthalmology, E.N.T., Dentistry, Orthopedic etc.
- 6. Teaching and training materials like pathology slides, X-ray plates, Ultra sonographic films and other invasive and non invasive examination material of teaching interest to the students or faculty of the DSHMC and NMRH Hospital should be provided by the Hospital free of charge or at cost if it involves considerable cost. This will help to augment the clinical & teaching material of the departments of the college.
- 7. Hon. Radiologist and Hon. Pathologist of the Hospital shall give training to the students / interns in Radiological Diagnostics, and Pathological procedures / Investigations respectively.
- 8. The resources of Pathology Laboratory and Radiology Department in the Sanjeevan Hospital shall be at the disposal of NM Ranade Memorial Homoeopathic Hospital, the teaching hospital of DSHMC on as required basis. All routine investigations of the I.P.D. patients of NMRH Hospital will be on concessional rates as mutually agreed (presently at 50%)
- 9. Head of each clinical departments and / or his nominee of the Hospital will be treated as Hon. Professor / Hon. Asst. Professor for the purpose of additional hospital training of the students & interns and may be taken on the roll of staff of the college. He/she is required to take the clinics on the O.P.D /I.P.D patients and teach interns /Students during rounds and in the OPDs.
- 10. Head of the unit or any honorary physician/surgeon in the department may be designated as the chief coordinator for all the clinical training program, attendance and certification of satisfactory completion of the term and duties in these departments. Attendance marking of the students and interns will be his responsibility. It should be collected from him every month and/or at the end of the term as decided upon mutually.

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11 Head of the Departments or any one or more senior honoraries may be taken on the college roll as visiting faculty members as Asst. Professor/ Professor Depending on the eligibility on a fixed or lecture basis honorarium if such need is felt at any time by the college in UG and PG departments and the shall be obliged to accept such assignment

12. Patient from the general wards of the hospital at least be available for any research projects of the college and NMRH Hospital, requiring such volunteers may be permitted to participate. These of course will be considered on the basis of prior free and voluntary contents of the patients and clearance on ethical, administrative and financial grounds/ clearance. The patents accrued from these research findings, results, information, communication and other publication rights etc. of these researches shall exclusively be the property of that of the MTE Society

13 The advance clinical training program shall be prepared by the HODs of various clinical Department of DSHMC term wise/year wise and will be given to Hospital through Principal to ensure adequate & proper Clinical Training of the students as per syllabus of M U H.S/ C.C.H

14 Central Display of Hospital Activities
With a view to enable mass scale viewing by students of operation theater/other such areas for central display. The Company will provide Central Display System through CCTV System at the hall near Mortuary on ground floor (ex day care ward) as a part of modernization/ infrastructure development and implement system of display in consultation with Principal/ PG Director. This will also ensure hygiene requirements for patients as well as visiting students/ faculty.

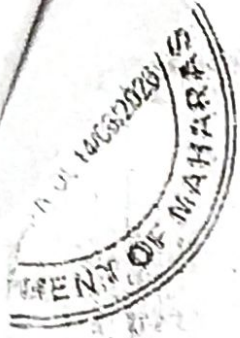

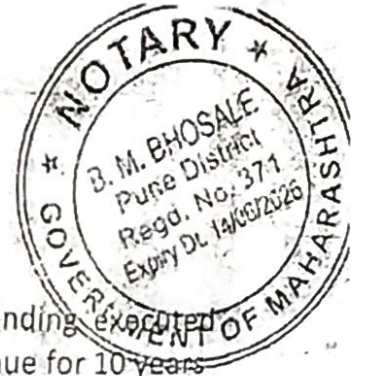

3. The Students and interns of the DSHMC in small batches will be allowed to be Posted as mutually convenient to both.
4. The patients of the Hospital both from O.P.D. & I.P.D. will be made available to the students of Obst-Gynaecology of DSHMC with prior permission of the hospital authorities for the clinical training of UG & PG students in terms.
5. Students/interns will be allowed to assist in operative procedure (major/minor) conduction of Labour, ward procedure etc.

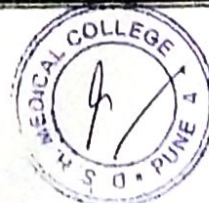

5. Conditions for DG Set :-

- a. Noise from the D.G. Set should be controlled by providing an acoustic enclosure or by treating the room acoustically.
- b. Industry should provide acoustic enclosure for control of noise. The acoustic enclosure/ acoustic treatment of the room should be designed for minimum 25 dB (A) insertion loss or for meeting the ambient noise standards, whichever is on higher side. A suitable exhaust muffler with insertion loss of 25 dB (A) shall also be provided. The measurement of insertion loss will be done at different points at 0.5 meters from acoustic enclosure/room and then average.
- c. The industry shall take adequate measures for control of noise levels from its own sources within the premises in respect of noise to less than 65 dB(A) during day time and 55 dB(A) during the night time. Day time is reckoned between 6 a.m. to 10 p.m and night time is reckoned between 10 p.m to 6 a.m.
- d. Industry should make efforts to bring down noise level due to DG set, outside industrial premises, within ambient noise requirements by proper siting and control measures.
- e. Installation of DG Set must be strictly in compliance with recommendations of DG Set manufacturer.
- f. A proper routine and preventive maintenance procedure for DG set should be set and followed in consultation with the DG manufacturer which would help to prevent noise levels of DG set from deteriorating with use
- g. D.G. Set shall be operated only in case of power failure

2. (i) BMW shall not be mixed with other wastes or reused or sold in any form.
 - (ii) BMW shall be segregated into containers / bags at the point of generation in accordance with Schedule-I prior to storage, treatment and disposal. The containers shall be labeled as specified in Schedule IV of BMW Management Rules, 2016.
 - (iii) If a container containing BMW is to be transported from the premises where BMW is generated to any waste treatment facility outside the premises, the container shall, apart from the Label as provided in part 'A' of the Schedule IV along with necessary information as specified in part 'B' prescribed of the Schedule IV and shall be transported by authorized Transporter only.
 - (iv) The vehicles used for transportation of bio medical waste shall comply with the conditions if any stipulated by the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board or Pollution Control Committee in addition to the requirement contained in the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (59 of 1988), if any or the Rules made there under for transportation of such infectious waste.
 - (v) Untreated human anatomical waste, animal anatomical waste, soiled waste and, biotechnology waste shall not be stored beyond a period of 48 hours.
 - (vi) Necessary protective wear for the waste handlers shall be provided by the hospital Authority.
 - (vii) Microbiology waste and all other clinical laboratory waste shall be pre-treated by sterilization to Log 6 or disinfection to Log 4, as per the World Health Organization guidelines before packing and sending to the common bio medical waste treatment facility.
 - (viii) You shall ensure proper collection of mercury spillage arising mainly due to breakage of thermometers pressure gauges (Sphygmomanometers) other equipments used in health care facilities (HCFs) as well as its storage in accordance with the Hazardous & Other wastes (Management & TM) Rules 2016 and returning it to the instrument manufacturers apart from necessary taking steps to ensure that the spilled mercury does not become a part of bio-medical or other solid wastes generated from the HCFs.
 - (ix) Authorized person shall obtain prior permission from MPCB for generation & disposal, if Bio-Medical waste quantity of category specified exceed the limits authorized at condition No. V. Above.
 - (x) Bar code & global positioning system shall be added by the Occupier and common bio medical waste treatment facility in one year time.
3. (i) You shall submit an Annual Report to the prescribed authority in Form-IV by 31st January every year including information about the categories and quantities of BMW handled during the preceding year.
 - (ii) You shall maintain records related to the generation, collection, reception, storage, transportation, treatment, disposal and/or any form of handling of BMW in accordance with these Rules and any guidelines issued.
 - (iii) All records shall be subject to inspection and verification by the prescribed authority at any time.
 4. When any accident occurs at any institution or facility or any other site where BMW is handled or during transportation of such waste, the authorized person shall report the accident in Form I to the prescribed authority forthwith.

General Conditions

- 1) The applicant shall provide facility for collection of environmental samples and samples of trade and sewage effluents, air emissions and hazardous waste to the Board staff at the terminal or designated points and shall pay to the Board for the services rendered in this behalf.
- 2) Hospital should monitor effluent quality, stack emissions and ambient air quality monthly/quarterly.
- 3) The applicant shall provide ports in the chimney/(s) and facilities such as ladder, platform etc. for monitoring the air emissions and the same shall be open for inspection to/and for use of the Board's Staff. The chimney(s) vents attached to various sources of emission shall be designated by numbers such as S-1, S-2, etc. and these shall be painted/ displayed to facilitate identification.
- 4) Whenever due to any accident or other unforeseen act or even, such emissions occur or is apprehended to occur in excess of standards laid down, such information shall be forthwith Reported to Board, concerned Police Station, office of Directorate of Health Services, Department of Explosives, Inspectorate of Factories and Local Body. In case of failure of pollution control equipments, the production process connected to it shall be stopped.
- 5) The applicant shall provide an alternate electric power source sufficient to operate all pollution control facilities installed to maintain compliance with the terms and conditions of the consent. In the absence, the applicant shall stop, reduce or otherwise, control production to abide by terms and conditions of this consent.
- 6) The firm shall submit to this office, the 30th day of September every year, the Environmental Statement Report for the financial year ending 31st March in the prescribed Form-V as per the provisions of rule 14 of the Environment (Protection) (Second Amendment) Rules, 1992.
- 7) The Hospital shall recycle/reprocess/reuse/recover Hazardous Waste as per the provision contain in the Hazardous & Other Wastes (M&TM) Rules 2016, which can be recycled /processed /reused /recovered and only waste which has to be incinerated shall go to incineration and waste which can be used for land filling and cannot be recycled/reprocessed etc should go for that purpose, in order to reduce load on incineration and landfill site/environment.

- 9) An inspection book shall be opened and made available to the Board's officers during their visit to the applicant.
- 10) The applicant shall make an **Combined Consent and Authorization (CCA)** for renewal of the consent at least 120 days before the date of the expiry of the consent.
- 11) Hospital shall strictly comply with the Water (P&CP) Act, 1974, Air (P&CP) Act, 1981 and Environmental Protection Act, 1986 and Hospital specific standard under EP Rules 1986 which are available on MPCB website (www.mpcb.gov.in).
- 12) The Hospital shall constitute an Environmental cell with qualified staff/personnel/agency to see the day to day compliance of consent condition towards Environment Protection.
